Is my child too ill for school?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school when they're unwell. There are government guidelines for schools and nurseries about managing specific infectious diseases at GOV.UK. These say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't. If you do keep your child at home, it's important to report the absence on Studybugs or phone the school on the first day (and each day of absence after) to let us know that your child won't be in and give us the reason. If your child is well enough to go to school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, let their teacher or the school office know.

Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel:

Next week, we will be encouraging children to walk, scooter or cycle to school- this is beneficial both for children and for the environment! Children will be tallying up the number of people who come to school in this way and the information will be entered into a national database as part of the programme.
