


# L in Reception

## **Understanding the World**



#### I am learning...

- To confidently talk about my family and community.

- To talk about images of familiar situations that happened in the past.
- To draw information from a simple map.
- That some places are special to members of my community.
- That people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways.
- That there are similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries.
- About the natural world.
- To describe what I see, hear and feel when I am outdoors.
- That the local area I live in is different to other environments.
- That the seasons change and have an effect on the natural world.
