## *News from the Federation – 26<sup>th</sup> April 2024*

We are often asked by parents what they can do to help with their children's learning at home. The first, and most important, thing is read, read, read! Parents in Year 1 will be aware that their child will be sitting the phonics screener in June so any extra practice would be very helpful in building the foundations for reading - you should have been pointed towards some resources but do speak to your child's class teacher if you have any questions. From Year 2 up, children have access to Accelerated Reader which they should be using to help guide their reading choices and to quiz on their books. Please do encourage children to use this; ideally, they would be reading at least 15 minutes every day. If you are interested, the BookTrust website shares a number of reasons why regular reading at home is so important for young children: <u>Booktrust research</u>.

### **School Disco**

## Start and end of the day

School starts at 8.40am for Years 1-6 and 8.45am for Reception. Please ensure children are in on time so they can make a smooth start to the day. School finishes at 3.10mp for Years 1-6 and 3.15pm for Reception. If you are running late, please let the office know. If you arrive more than 10 minutes late, your child will go to After School Club and you may incur a charge for the session.

Please can we also ask that anyone driving to school is particularly careful around the site at the start and the end of the school day.

#### Is my child too sick to send to school?
