This term, our topic is 'The World We Live In'. To kickstart the unit, the children had a Q&A session with a student rower from Cambridge University Boat Club who rowed in this year's reserve boat. In the coming weeks, the children will be focussing on local history, in and around Cambridge. The children thoroughly enjoyed brainstorming questions and asking questions about the lead up to the race and the event itself.

Our Science unit for Summer 1 is 'Plants'. So far, the children have planted tomatoes and we will be discussing the changes as we observe them over the coming weeks. We have been learning about what plants need to grow and the different parts of a plant.
