

PTA Chair Person Vacancy

The formal role of the chair is to lead and ensure good decision making in the meetings of the trustees of the PTA. These set overall strategy for the PTA and review that the fundraising events and spending is consistent with this strategy. In practice for our PTA this will mean the chair needs to ensure we have the right number of trustees and that they are appropriately engaged; that during meetings of trustees clear decisions are made on what types of fundraising events and spending we want to support; and that at reasonably regular intervals (perhaps every 6 months) the trustees briefly review the fundraising and spending.

In addition we would also of course welcome the chair taking part in initiating, planning and carrying out the fundraising events but these are not formal parts of the role and can be delegated to other members of PTA or parents so long as the overall policies of the PTA are followed.

Code Breaking News! A parent volunteer, who is also a STEM Ambassador, has kindly offered to start a code club after Christmas. It will be a Friday club, starting on the 19th January, from 3:15 – 4:10. The club is capped at 12 children and is open to Years 5 and 6 for children who are new to coding. Careers Related Learning (CRL):

At the Federation, we are incorporating into our curriculum a 'careers related learning' approach. Research (conducted by The CEC, 2021) has shown that by 6 years old children start to adopt stereotypes based on gender, ethnicity and social background. At 9 years old children start to abandon fantasy careers and start to become more aware of potential constraints on their futures. The aim of the approach is four- fold: to challenge bias and stereotypes, to make links explicit in the curriculum, to forge meaningful encounters with local employers and to engage parents.

To open up the world of work to our children, we are looking for volunteers to talk about their job and workplace at an assembly. We are also seeking out people willing to invite us into their place of work to learn more about it.
