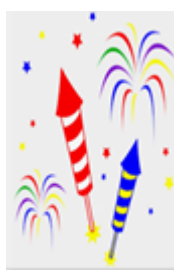
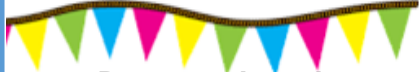

This month we have started to learn about area by counting squares of different shapes. Now we will be refreshing and developing our multiplication and division skills.

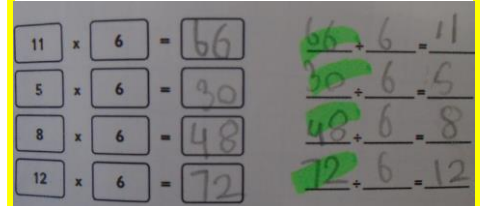
We are linking our multiplication and division skills, e.g.
