Choir:

Clubs:

Electrical Safety – E Bikes and E Scooters:

You may be aware of a house fire that occurred in Cambridge at the end of June 2023 which sadly took the lives of two children and their mother. It is believed that the house fire was caused by an e-scooter charger/battery. The online home fire safety check is a useful tool, not only does it give advice using a risk matrix, it also can be used as a referral tool for us to send face to face specialist officers to a property if members of the public would like a visit.

Parents' School Preference Advisor:

The service offers families advice and support when applying for schools, either when admissions open for transition on the 11th September 2023 or for in-year applications. They are able to advise how the transfer and admissions process works, as well as supporting the understanding of policies and criteria for different schools. Also, they can support the appeals process and issues concerning transport.

OPAL:

The staff all attended an OPAL training session on Monday 4th September and enjoyed discussing what play is, how play experiences have changed over time and how we can facilitate meaningful, fun, creative play experiences throughout our school day.

Opal's mission is to *ensure that every schoolchild has an amazing playtime every day with no exceptions.* Their research has shown that at OPAL Schools benefit from the following:

- 80% drop in reported behaviour and first aid incidents
- 20% more afternoon teaching time because there are less issue on the playground
- Compliance with wellbeing inspection requirements
- Increased resilience, collaboration and inclusion
