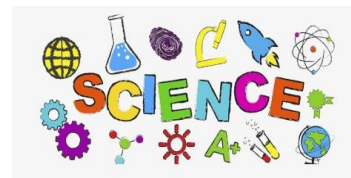

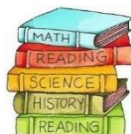
Our text for Summer 1 is 'Fitz and Will the Cambridge Cats, The May Ball Adventure' by Laura Robson Brown. We have been rehearsing our story, using actions and practicing writing up the story.

Over the coming weeks we will innovate our story by changing the characters and location. We will improve our writing by using adjectives and thinking of exciting openings and endings.



Our science unit for Summer 1 is plants. So far, the children have planted tomatoes and we will be discussing the changes as we observe them over the coming weeks. As we move through the unit, we will learning about the differences between evergreen and deciduous plants as well as their different parts.

This term our topic is 'The Wonderful World We Live In'.
