

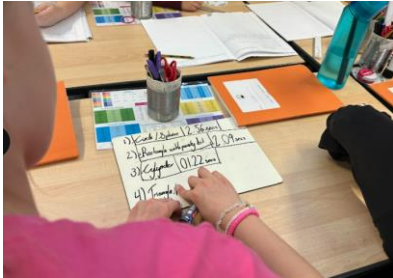


in Year 5

We dressed up for World Book Day and had Matilda's family, TV Man and so many more characters! It was lovely to see the children enjoying it so much.



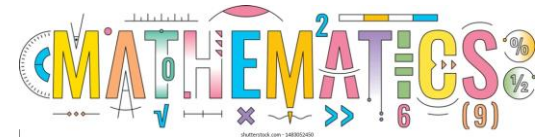

In Maths this month, we have been focusing on fractions. We have thought about adding, subtracting and multiplying fractions which is really tricky stuff!

We have then moved onto Fractions of Amounts, and how to find the fraction of an integer ($1/2$ of 56 = 28, or $1/3$ of 56 = 18.6). Ask you child how to work this out, it is a lot of different steps!

Finally, we have moved on to decimals and using our knowledge of fractions to work out the decimal point ($1/2 = 0.5$).

The children have worked incredibly hard on this module, and I am very impressed with their knowledge!



In English, we have been writing non-chronological reports, and moral stories.

We have learned about the boy who cried wolf, and the meaning behind the story. The children were then given the chance to write their own moral story, thinking about what lesson should be learned and what we might do if we received a lottery ticket. Answers included: buy a house, get a dog, or buy lots of chocolate!

We also celebrated Mars Day, a STEM activity, and took part in 'Mars Hour', which was an opportunity to learn from space experts.

We heard from Tim Peake who is a real astronaut! He chatted about upcoming missions and answered questions about human spaceflight.
