This week Miss Hansen has been competing at Henley Royal Regatta in the Wargrave Challenge Cup, representing the City of Cambridge Rowing Club in our women's club eight. Held on a stunning stretch of the River Thames, Henley Royal Regatta is one of the most prestigious and historic events in the rowing world, dating back to 1839. The five-day, invitation-only event follows a head-to-head knockout format, where two crews race side by side over the famous 2,112-metre course, with only the winner advancing to the next round. The Wargrave Challenge Cup showcases top-tier women's club eights and, this year, features competition not only from across the UK but also from international crews hailing from Canada, Germany, Australia, and beyond. With Olympians and elite athletes frequently among the field, it's a true honour to have the chance to race on such a legendary stage.
