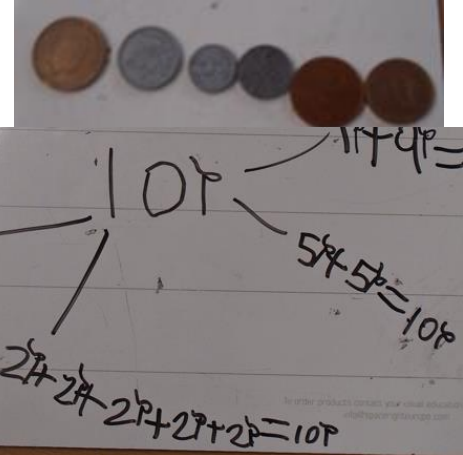

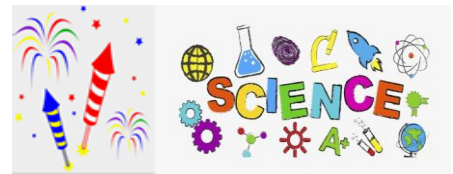
In Maths, we have been busy learning about British currency: pounds and pence. The children have been practising with plastic money, giving them hands-on experience to help understand the value of money and how to use it.

Identifying different coins - finding out we don't have a 3p, 4p or 8p coin!



Year 2 pupils have been learning how to write diary entries, inspired by Samuel Pepys' account of the Great Fire of London.
