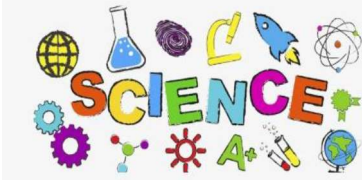


FEBRUARY in Year 3

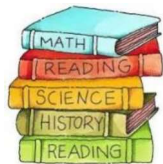

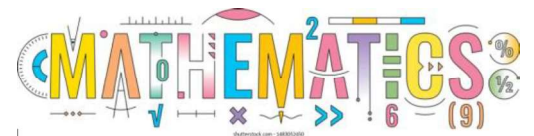


Year 3 pupils have been learning how to write diary entries. We explored the features of this type of text by reading examples and identifying key elements to create a toolkit. We are now starting to innovate our own diary entry using the model text.

In Guided Reading, we read the 'The Case of the Cambridge Mummy'. Within this, the children practiced reading with prosody and accuracy.



In History, we continued learning about ancient civilisations, including the Shang Dynasty, Indus Valley and Ancient Egypt. The children enjoyed using symbols from the Shang Dynasty to create their own sentences. We also developed our inference skills by analysing artefacts from Ancient Egypt to deepen our understanding of what the past was like at that point in time.



In Mathematics, we have been looking at statistics. We collected data and recorded our results using a tally chart. We also interpreted pictograms and completed reasoning questions.

After the half term break, we began learning about measurement. The children enjoyed measuring different items around the classroom in centimeters and converting the measurements to mm.
