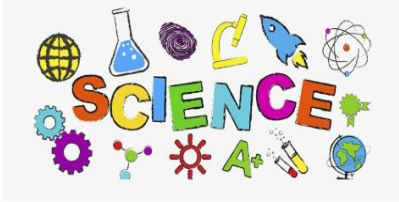


FEBRUARY in Year 3

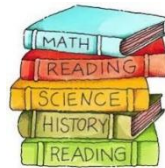
Reader of the Month –Clara



Year 3 pupils continued to learn how to write diary entries. After exploring the features of this type of text by reading examples and identifying key elements, they innovated their own diary entry using the model text.

In Reading lessons, children read the 'The Case of the Cambridge Mummy'. Within this, the children practiced reading with prosody and accuracy.

This was then linked to DT where children developed clay working techniques like those in the book.



In History, we continued learning about ancient civilisations, including the Shang Dynasty, Indus Valley and Ancient Egypt. The children enjoyed using symbols from the Shang Dynasty to create their own sentences. We also developed our inference skills by analysing artefacts from Ancient Egypt to deepen our understanding of what the past was like at that point in time. We understand that historians have to use their inference skills a lot when studying ancient artefacts!



In Mathematics, we have been looking at statistics. We collected data and recorded our results using a tally chart. We also interpreted pictograms and completed some reasoning questions related to the graphs we were looking at.

After the half term break, we began learning about measurement. The children enjoyed measuring different items around the classroom in centimeters and then converting the measurements to mm. We learnt that there are 10mm in 1cm.

Well done to children who continue to work hard at learning their times tables and using TTRS.
