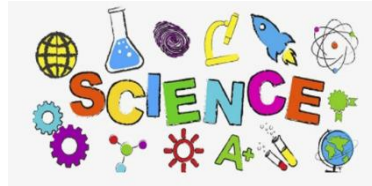
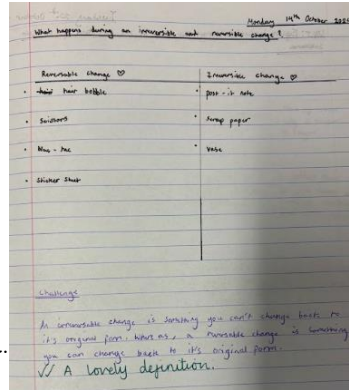


OCTOBER

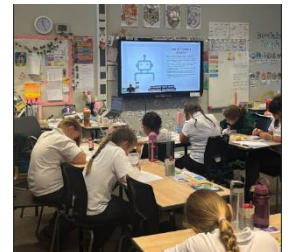

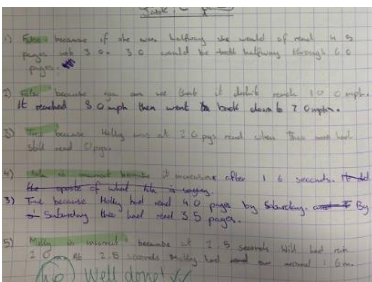
In English this month, we have been writing suspense stories!

Looking through our model text, we identified that suspense stories can make you feel uneasy and scared, so we looked at using fronted adverbials, adjectives and adverbs to promote those emotions to the reader.



We had a very exciting visit this month! Author Ben Dean joined us virtually to talk to us about his new book!

We were able to ask Ben some questions and the children said they enjoyed learning more about the process of writing a book.



In Maths this month, we finished our work on Addition and Subtraction with multiple step word problems - the children had to read the question carefully, find the key information and identify which operation they needed to conduct to find their answer.

We then moved on to our next unit: Statistics! We have been learning about line graphs, and how we can interpret and use these (we even used our knowledge from the last unit to help us!).
