In Religious Education, we have continued to explore creation stories from different religions, such as Hinduism. This finished with making a poster about describing the key features of each story.



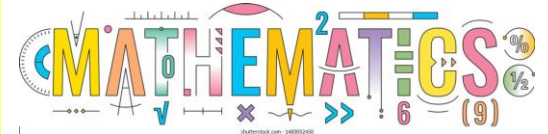
