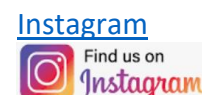


News from the Federation 14th February 2025

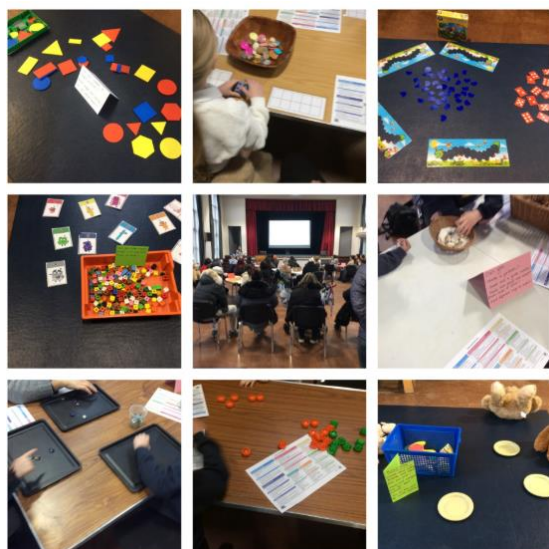
STEM EVENT, Thursday 13th March 2025
