





Phonics Screening Check

- Practising basic skills e.g. counting to 20 and 2s, 5s, 10s
- Reading
- looking out of the window, can you see anything that is red, blue or green, introducing adjectives to describe
- Writing / drawing a diary during holiday periods
- Writing lists, letters, cards
- Make up stories
- Using and counting money
- Reading analogue and digital clocks and watches
- Cooking weighing and measuring ingredients
