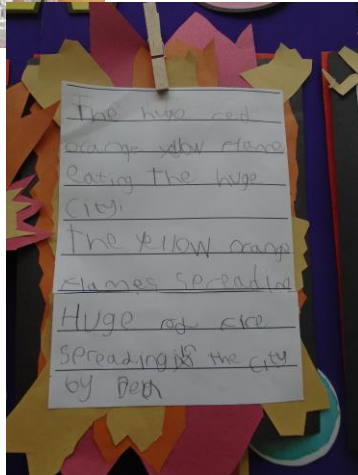


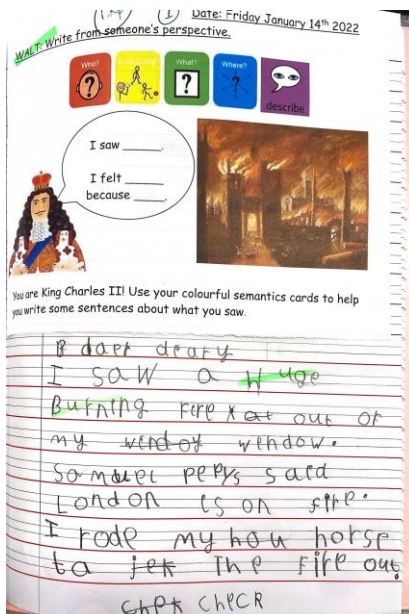
January in Year 2
