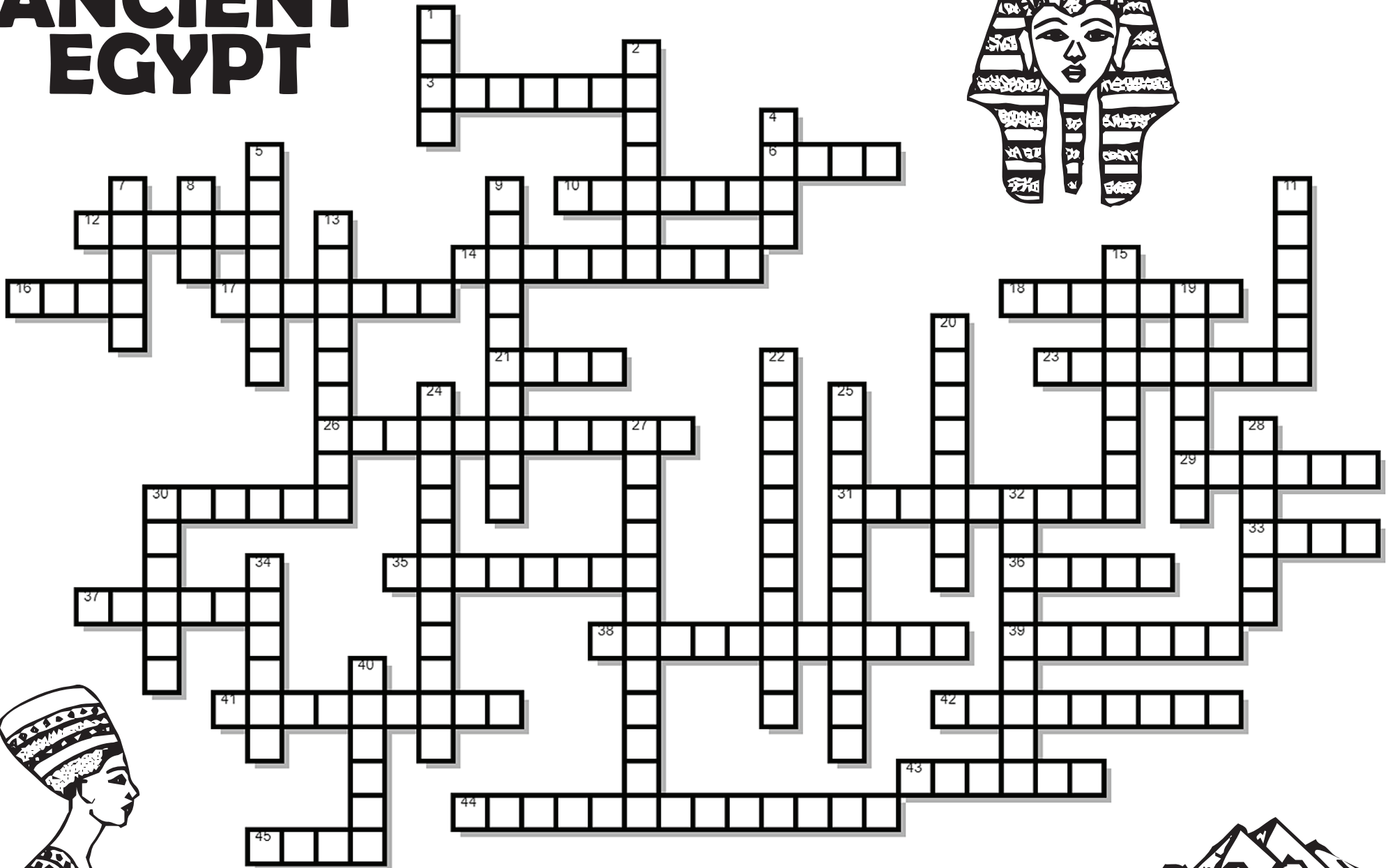


ANCIENT EGYPT



ACROSS

- 3 Early form of a tomb, rectangular in shape with sloping sides and a flat roof;
- 6 Domesticated bovine animals used in farming (plural);
- 10 Stone structure with a square base and four triangular sides that form a point at the top, built as a tomb;
- 12 A special adviser to the pharaoh, the most powerful position after the king in Ancient Egypt;
- 14 People who are skilled in a particular craft (potter, carpenter);
- 16 The river of life ancient Egypt;
- 17 A king of ancient Egypt;
- 18 A two-wheeled horse-drawn vehicle used in warfare, two soldiers rode in this, one would drive and the other would fight (using a bow and arrow or a spear);
- 21 Ancient Egyptian symbol (a cross with a loop at the top), means "life";
- 23 A piece of jewellery that is worn around the wrist;
- 26 (two words) covered urns used to hold the internal organs from an embalmed body (there were four of them);
- 29 A hand-operated device for lifting water to irrigate land;
- 30 A tool with a short handle and a curved blade, used for cutting grain crops;
- 31 Ancient Egyptians made great preparations for this life after death, where they would lead a new life;
- 33 A tall, slender-leaved plant of the grass family that grows in water or on marshy ground, its stem used for making paper ;
- 35 An object that was made in the past, especially one that is of historical interest, preserved, studied and exhibited in museums;
- 36 A dead body that is prevented from decaying;
- 37 A person employed to take notes and make copies of documents;
- 38 A stone coffin, often decorated;
- 39 Long rolls of paper for writing, used for storing information on;
- 41 Queen of Egypt, the last Ptolemaic (Macedonian dynasty) ruler; known for her alliance with Julius Caesar and Mark Antony, at the end bitten by an asp;
- 42 A large reptile with a hard skin, a long and narrow nose, and a very strong jaw that lives in and near the river Nile;
- 43 A person who performs religious duties in a temple;
- 44 Someone who studies objects of people who lived in the past;
- 45 A plant with blue flowers grown for seed (linseed) and for textile fibre (linen) made from its stalks;

DOWN

- 1 A large stone structure or underground room where an important person is buried;
- 2 A material prepared from the stem of a water plant (reed), used for writing on;
- 4 Deities worshipped all over ancient Egypt;
- 5 To have or show a strong feeling of respect and admiration for a god;
- 7 Strong cloth made from the fibres of the flax plant;
- 8 A covering of artificial hair worn on the head, preferred by the upper class;
- 9 The practice or system of supplying land with water so that crops will grow;
- 11 An object or small piece of jewellery thought to give protection, worn because it is believed to protect against evil, bad luck, or disease;
- 13 A drawing or carving with an oval border bearing a name;
- 15 A group of valuable objects, Tutankhamun was famous for his;
- 19 A tall stone column with four sloping sides and a pointed top, made in honour of an important person or event;
- 20 People who serve in an army, wear uniform, armed with weapons (spears, swords, bow and arrows), and protect the kingdom from invaders;
- 22 Pictures or symbols that represent words, syllables, or sounds;
- 24 A round, thick-skinned fruit with juicy, sweet, red seeds;
- 25 Boy-king famous for his tomb containing fabulous treasure, discovered in 1922 by English archaeologist Howard Carter;
- 27 A piece of rock (a fragment of a larger stele) that holds the key to understanding Egyptian hieroglyphs, written in three scripts: hieroglyphic, demotic, and Greek (two words);
- 28 A mineral salt found in dried lake beds, used in burial rites (it makes the mummy crisp);
- 30 A type of large beetle (an insect with a hard shell-like back), a symbol of immortality, and transformation, and a popular amulet;
- 32 A white or light grey rock that is used as a building material, one of the main building stones of ancient Egypt, the material of choice for pyramids, mastaba tombs, and temples;
- 34 A building used for the worship of a god;
- 40 A large stone statue with a lion's body and a person's head, stands in the desert near Cairo;
