

What we are learning about:

Our topic/theme this half term is:

Magic in the Making

The key texts we will be using will be:

Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone
Fantastic Beasts and Where to Find Them

We will be learning to:

With this term's topic centred around JK Rowling's Harry Potter series; pupils will be transported into a magical world through potion making, creating the scenes of Hogwarts through art and literature, and reading a range of fiction and non-fiction magical texts. The theme covered this half term will include individuality and conformity, encouraging pupils to embrace diversity in their community.

Mathematics:

In Mathematics, our focus will be pupils' understanding, explaining and reasoning with place value. We will also consolidate and extend skills in addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

We will develop a mastery of mathematical language to help students explain their understanding of concepts in more detail.

What we are learning about

English

Reading:

Our key text is 'Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone' which we will be reading together as a whole class. In our reading, we are learning to identify and discuss themes, as well as, recall and retrieve facts. We will be able to make comparisons within and across different texts. Making inferences (e.g. feelings, thoughts, and motives) is another focus for this half-term. We will also look at JK Rowling's writing style and how she creates particular characters.

Writing:

This half term we will be using the 'Harry Potter' novels as inspiration for a range of writing tasks. Like we are in Reading, we will have a look at JK Rowling's writing style as a model to assist us with our own writing.

We will use a range of stimuli e.g. drama, film and written texts to support our writing of descriptive letters and suspense stories.

Place value, greater than, less than, ten thousands, hundred thousands, millions, order, ascending, descending, rounding.

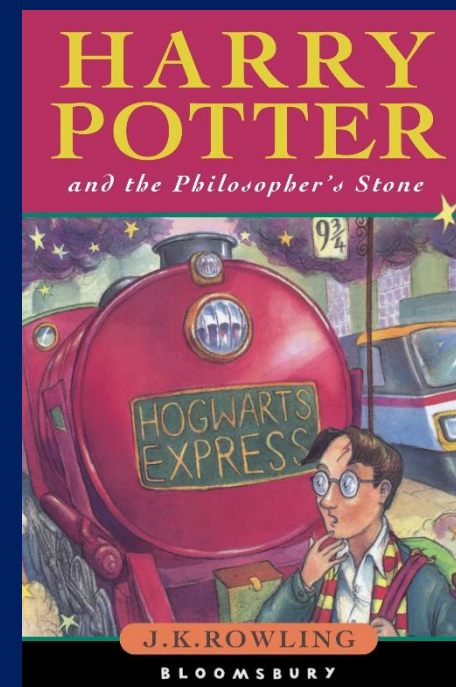
Homework:
