The following passage about Anzac Day has incorrect spelling and punctuation. After identifying the errors, rewrite the text with the correct spelling and punctuation.

**Anzac Day** is a day of remembrance that takes place on 25<sup>th</sup> April. It is commemorated in **Australia** and **New Zealand**, or by **Australians** and **New Zealanders** living elsewhere in the world. It is held in memory of the members of the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps, also known as the Anzacs, who lost **their** lives in battle.

The Anzacs landed at **Gallipoli** on 25<sup>th</sup> April 1915. This was the **first** major combat of the war for **these two** countries. At the end of 1915, the Anzac forces were **rescued** from the **beach**. **Generals** and **commanders** were **worried** about the high number of casualties.
